TMEA has captured daily updates as they became known to us through our partner contacts, as well as from media reports (links provided). Please note that TMEA has not independently verified the media reports, and that the details below change rapidly and may become obsolete or overtaken by events as quickly as it is distributed.

## 2. Overview

- 2.1 Disputes over the authenticity of tests is have been the major factor in continued tensions between EAC neighbours, especially Kenya and Tanzania. More than 100 Kenyan lorries were impounded by Tanzanian authorities at the Isebania border since 9<sup>th</sup> June. Frustrated drivers have threatened to stage a protest, appealing to the Kenyan government to intervene since some of the cargo included highly perishable goods like fish, and that they risked incurring heavy losses. Story here. Kenyan Cabinet Secretary for EAC Affairs and Regional Development, Adan Mohamed, spoke to the media about the situation and EAC response on June 14<sup>th</sup>. Watch here. On 15<sup>th</sup> June, normal border operations at Namanga resumed smoothly with Tanzania agreeing to have drivers subjected to testing by Kenyan health officials. On 18<sup>th</sup> June, reports noted a fresh agreement for joint testing at border points rather than at points of departure. Story here.
- 2.2 On June 16<sup>th</sup> TMEA and the European Union signed a €5 million agreement to support the Safe Trade Emergency Facility, in the presence of the Cabinet Secretary for Industry, Trade & Cooperatives, Betty Maina, and the Secretary for EAC Affairs & Regional Development, Adan Mohamed. The funds from the European Union will fund the Kenyan component of the programme making the EU the largest donor to the programme. More here.
- 2.3 TMEA is supporting the Kenyan Ministry of Transport with the upgrade of an access road at the Malaba border point to ease traffic congestion that has been made worse by coronavirus. In recent weeks, truck drivers have been stuck in traffic stretching 40km along the Bungoma-Kanduyi-Malaba road due to lengthy wait for results of the Covid-19 test that is mandatory before crossing the border. <a href="Story here">Story here</a>.
- 2.4 East Africa member states are set to roll out digital Covid-19-free certificates to eliminate the possibility of truck drivers using fake documents to travel within the region. It will be implemented as soon as member states put in place technology that will link all the laboratories and ensure a seamless operation. Story here.
- 2.5 "Higher levels of internal trade will help wean Africa off its reliance on the external markets so exposed by the pandemic." TMEA Op-Ed highlights the critical ongoing AfCFTA efforts during the pandemic.
- 2.6 CEOs of the Private Sector Associations in the EAC met on June 9 to discuss the ongoing border issues. The meeting agreed that the East African Business Council (EABC) and National focal points should enhance advocacy efforts on the free movement of cargo and organise border visits to assess the situation at the borders. EABC noted TMEA's journey management system/electronic cargo tracking that had been endorsed by EAC ministers the previous week.

#### Kenya

- The High Court in Kenya has suspended the notice issued by the Ministry of Transport making it
  compulsory from 1st June 2020 for goods detained for Uganda, Rwanda and South Sudan to be
  transported from the Port of Mombasa by Standard Gauge Railway (SGR) to the Naivasha Inland
  Container Depot. According to the petitioner, the claim that the measure would help contain the
  COVID-19 pandemic is not backed by any scientific study.
- Kenya's foreign direct investment (FDI) inflows fell \$294 million (Sh31.3 billion) last year, annual
  estimates by a UN agency show, partly reflecting depressed growth in new jobs that has been
  worsened by the global coronavirus pandemic. Here
